# SHOW REGULATIONS

COMPETITORS ARE TO COMPLY WITH THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY OF TASMANIA  
CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND GENERAL REGULATIONS IN ADDITION TO THESE SHOW REGULATIONS

- **Prizes:** Prizes presented by the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association (Tas branch). The following are the conditions of competition under which the prizes presented by ASSBA (Tas) are offered, which include Border Leicester, Hampshire Down, Ryeland, Southdown, Suffolk and Dorset Horn (breeds now registered in Tas). The ASSBA (Tas) awards, as from 1st Jan 2013, will be for Champion Ram and Champion Ewe for each British Breed at the Royal Hobart Show. Awards: Champion Ram \$40; Reserve Champion Ram \$15; Champion Ewe \$40; Reserve Champion Ewe \$15.
- Exhibits must bear the hallmark of the breeder's flock number, as required by the relevant breed society. All sheep entered in this section must be registered in a recognised public flock book.
- **Health:** Sheep coming from a property which is under quarantine for foot-rot or any other disease will not be allowed on RAST property. The RAST has the right to have all sheep carrying ticks, lice or foot-rot immediately removed from the Showgrounds. Entries accepted only from accredited Ovine Brucellosis Free flocks. A signed Declaration (form attached) is to accompany all entries.
- Sheep must be penned as directed by the Steward in charge. Exhibit Number must be worn by exhibit or handler before being eligible for Judging and shall remain on until completion of Judging.
- The judge is to be instructed not to award 1st place in any class where in his opinion sheep are below show standard. Entries in 1½ year old classes in British and Prime Lamb Breeds, with four teeth up, will be eligible for showing in the next age class. Sheep imported into the state will be excluded from showing unless they have completed blood tests under the Ovine Brucellosis regulation. With the exception of group classes, sheep may only be entered in one class. An animal from a pen of two or a pen of three may not be entered in a single entry class, with the exception that a lamb from ewe and lamb class will be eligible to compete in single lamb class. If requested by the judge, a ewe/ram may come from any pair for championship judging. Pedigree cards may be displayed after completion of judging. Cards to be no larger than 30cm x 23cm.
- **British & Prime Lamb Breeds:** Judges are instructed to penalise any sheep entered in a shorn class and carrying, in the judges' opinion, too great a length of wool. The Tasmanian branch of the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association Limited may appoint inspectors to check on wool length of entries in Shorn Sheep classes. All sheep may be subject to inspection by the inspector appointed by the breed society concerned. If the animal is not acceptable to the inspector, exhibition and/or sale of such animal will not be permitted. Sheep entered in general classes may be offered for sale by private negotiation with an agent of choice. No agent's signs to be displayed until judging is completed in all general classes.
- **Poll Dorset:** Poll Dorset rams may be inspected in accordance with the rules in the current flock book.
- **Wool Sheep:** It is a condition of entry that Merino, Polwarth and Corriedale are shorn to respective breed society regulations. Sheep shorn during the previous year are eligible to enter classes where indicated. Exhibitors must state date of last shearing, whether machine or hand shorn and give correct ages when forwarding entries. All stud sheep may be subject to inspection by the inspector appointed by the breed society concerned. If the animal is not acceptable to the inspector, exhibition and/or sale of such animal will not be permitted. A ewe over 2½ years is not eligible for championship honours unless the ewe has a lamb at foot. Horn fire-brands must be covered on Merinos. If sufficient entries are received in Merino classes, individual classes may be allocated at the Steward's discretion.
- **Polwarth:** Only sheep registered or eligible for registration in Polwarth Sheep Breeders' Association Flock Book will be accepted for entry. Polwarth Sheep exhibited shall either have fully developed horns or be poley to the extent of having hollows in the head or movable buttons. Sheep shall not be oiled or dressed with any foreign matter whatever, ordinary dipping for parasites excepted, and shall not be gone over with shears except for plucks, dags, treatment for flyblow or ringing.
- **Shearing Regulations:** Must be fairly and evenly shorn and must not carry more than 13mm of wool as at 15th August in year of showing (Corriedales - 1st July). (In Wool) As above but for previous year of showing. Wool length may be inspected and, if necessary, appropriate action will be taken.
- **Johne's Disease:** All exhibits entered into the Royal Hobart Show must be vaccinated or from the MAP testing program (Signed Declaration Form and Waiver to be submitted with entry forms)
- **Personal Information & Privacy:** The Royal Agricultural Society of Tasmania (RAST) collects personal information from exhibitors in competitions conducted by the Society. Verification of the accuracy of this data may be obtained through contact with the RAST Section Secretary. This information is used only for the purpose related to the conduct of the events run by the Society and is not divulged to third parties. However, entrant's names and contact details may be released to duly authorised parties in respect to matters of animal health and safety. The names of exhibitors may be included in catalogues published by the Society and successful exhibitors' Names released for general publication. If you do not provide the information requested on the competition entry form, we may not be able to accept your entry.

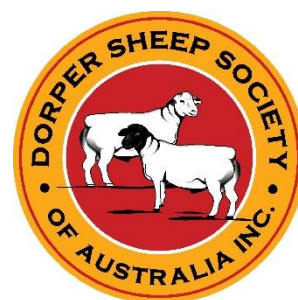

# BIOSECURITY INFORMATION

## NILS

Sheep & goats born from the start of 2017 must be identified with an NLIS tag (visual not electronic) before leaving any property. Older sheep and goats do not need to be tagged until the start of 2021.

## Ticks, Lice, Footrot or other disease

No Sheep will be allowed on the property of the RAST which comes from a property that is under quarantine for Footrot or any other disease. Council has the right to have any animal carrying Ticks, Lice, Footrot or other disease immediately removed from the Showground.

## Brucellosis

All sheep entries must be from accredited brucellosis free flocks.

## Johne's Disease

All exhibits entered into the Royal Hobart Show must be vaccinated or from the MAP testing program

Please complete the **Transfer Information Required** for Cattle/Sheep/Goats Going to Show form and return with your Entry and Payment forms

Exhibitors must fill out the **Animal Health Statement** otherwise entries will not be accepted

## Mandatory eID for Sheep & Goats begins 1 January 2025

All sheep and goats born on or after 1 January 2025 that move off a farm or other registered agricultural property, including backyards, will be required to have an NLIS approved eID tag.

All livestock supply chain participants must be ready to scan eID tags from 1 January 2025.

To support the eID rollout the Government is providing funding for scanning equipment and has reduced the price of eID tags.

# NATIONAL SHEEP HEALTH DECLARATION - EXPLANATORY NOTES

## Overview

Completing this National Sheep Health Declaration (NSHD) will assist prospective buyers to make an informed decision about the health status and management history of these sheep. The NSHD is mandatory for all sheep movements in SA and for sheep being moved into NSW and Tasmania. It is voluntary in other states.

## Livestock Production Assurance (1)

Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) program accreditation means that a property must have a biosecurity plan for the property. The National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual for Grazing Livestock Production can be used to develop plans or further information including templates is available at: [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/farm-biosecurity-plan](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/farm-biosecurity-plan)

## Footrot (3 and 4)

3. Virulent footrot is defined differently in each state. For information on this and interstate movements of sheep, producers should visit the relevant state department website or contact animal health staff from that department.
4. If answered Yes, all mobs should have been checked during at least one spread period, and any lameness investigated, with no symptoms of the disease observed. If answered no, producers can add any information about the disease and their management of it; e.g. whether any testing has been carried out, or what treatments may have been used recently.

## Lice (5)

All mobs should be checked for lice at least twice each year. Any sheep seen with rubbed fleece or pulled wool should be checked for lice as a matter of urgency. Further information is available at: [www.paraboss.com.au](http://www.paraboss.com.au)

## Approved Vaccinate (7)

A sheep that is identified by an NLIS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:

- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine by 16 weeks of age, OR
- vaccinated with an approved JD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
  - was in the SheepMAP, or
  - had undertaken a negative Faecal 350 test in the two (2) years preceding the vaccination, or
  - had a Negative Abattoir 500 status at the time of vaccination.

## SheepMAP (8)

An audited quality assurance program incorporating a property biosecurity plan, animal health risk assessment, testing, and movement controls that provide a source of low risk animals. Note - the level of testing varies depending on the status. Date of last test should be recorded in Q9.

## Types of tests that may be recorded (9)

**Faecal 350:** A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or High Throughput Johnes's (HT-J) PCR in pools of up to 50 sheep. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

**Abattoir 500:** At least 500 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

**Abattoir 150:** At least 150 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 12 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for JD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

## JD management practices (10)

Any other management practices carried out for JD could be recorded here; e.g. types of introductions to the flock, or veterinary investigations.

## Other relevant health information (11)

Any other information that a producer thinks may be relevant can be recorded here; e.g. participation in an active grower group, One Biosecurity, or other biosecurity initiatives, mulesing status, pain relief usage, etc.

## Declaration

Signing this declaration has legal significance under fair trading and other relevant state legislation. Regulatory authorities may also take legal action, and purchasers may seek damages for any information that is incorrect. Before signing you must be satisfied you understand all elements of the document, and these explanatory notes.
