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Vineyard of the Year Field Day

As part of the 2024 Royal Hobart Wine Show late last year, one of Australia's top wine shows, Pressing Matters Vineyard was awarded the coveted title of Gravitas Energy Tasmanian Vineyard of the Year.

Next month, on Friday June 20, the Vineyard hosts a field day for the wine industry and wine buffs. The Award recognises viticultural excellence in producing high quality wines. The field day gives Pressing Matters the opportunity to explain its vineyard management principles which led to the Award.

Over three hours, field day participants will enjoy lunch, hear presentations, including a Q&A session, and undertake an escorted tour of the vineyard.

The day commences with a vineyard lunch at 12.30pm, followed by presentations, including a trophy handover of a bronze work of art by Tasmanian Sculptor Stephen Walker, and comments by Jeremy Dineen, Chair of the Royal Agricultural Society of Tasmania's wine show committee, and Greg Mellick, a principal owner of Pressing Matters. A vineyard tour will occur at 1.45pm.







Wine Show Comes to Life

We're gearing up for the 2025 Snap Printing Royal Hobart Wine Show, the 52nd Show since it was first held.

Entries will open next month for both the wine show and the associated Tasmanian Vineyard of the Year, which is now an integral part of the wine show.

Entries will close on September 23, and Judging this year will commence on November 10 and run until November 13.

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First Round Winners Royal Tasmanian Fine Food Awards

Westbury, Sheffield, Fentonbury, Cambridge, Glenora and Koonya are all among the winners in the first round of the 2025 Royal Tasmanian Fine Food Awards, which were judged earlier this month in Hobart.

Food producers in Oatlands and Hobart also competed successfully against entries from all over Australia. Three days of judging took place in the first section of the Awards: the Tasmanian Flour Mills Bakery Awards, the Tassal Group Preserves Awards, and the Valhalla Ice Cream Sweet & Spicy Awards.

Food Awards continue in June

The second round of judging is about to commence in the Fine Food Awards.

Three sections are to be evaluated in the coming days: the Pine Tea & Coffee Tea and Tisane Awards; the DIAA Dairy & Ice cream Awards; and the Old Woolstore Apartment Hotel Plant Based Products.

As consumer interest in plant-based foods continues to rise entries in this section are up 20% on last year.

Being judged over the three categories are a wide range of food and drink, from cheese and ice cream, and pure and herbal teas, to plant-based cakes, plant-based burgers and tofu.

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Showground Redevelopment

Excavation work has now commenced at the Showground for foundations in preparation for the Sustainable Tasmania (ST) energy capacitators which are to be operated at the Showground to provide a local electricity grid stabilisation service.

As we reported in last month's The RASTUS, ST was established by the RAST to provide power grid support in Hobart's northern suburbs and at the same time generate revenue to assist the Society in its many programs and activities.





Ongoing works also include hydroseeding to reduce dust and increase grass.

Wendy Probin: a willing and enthusiastic volunteer
