Originality will be taken into account and must be the entrants own work

Ribbon and wire are permissible in these classes. Cleats must be placed on the bottom of the board to enable exhibit to be moved easily.

Boards must not exceed 38cm in diameter or 40cm in height, on all decorated cakes unless otherwise stated.

The following are not permitted: pins, wires that penetrate the covering of the cake, inedible ornaments, decorations or metallic paint

Non-toxic gold and silver may be used to highlight a name or small feature. Dummies may be used to substitute cake unless otherwise stated

Class 28 OPEN - Special Occasion Cake eg Christmas, Birthday or Wedding. Must include a greeting. May be one or more tiers. Base board not to exceed 38cm in diameter and height not to exceed 40cm when measured from the table.
